
The particulars of organization, functions and duties

Existing Organisational Structure of DGAD



The Directorate General of Anti-Dumping and Allied Duties was constituted in April 1998 under Ministry of Commerce and Industry and is headed by the Designated Authority.

The role of DGAD is to ensure a level playing field to the Domestic Industry against the adverse impact of the unfair trade practices like dumping and actionable subsidies from any exporting country, by using Trade Remedial methods under relevant framework of WTO arrangements, Customs Tariff Act & Rules and other relevant laws and International agreements, in a transparent and time bound manner. Thus, the responsibility of the Directorate extends to carrying out investigations and recommending, where required, the amount of Antidumping/Countervailing Duty on the identified articles as would be adequate to remove injury to the domestic industry, under the Customs Tariff Act and Rules.

The major Functions being carried out by DGAD are as given below:

- i. Conducting Anti-Dumping investigations
- ii. Conducting Anti-subsidy (Countervailing Duty) investigations
- iii. Conducting Anti-Circumvention investigations
- iv. Defending Indian exporters from various countervailing duty investigations carried out by foreign agencies.
